Interior Design Sketch

Event Details: (Level 1, 2, or 3. This is an individual event)

Directions: Interior Design Sketch, an individual event, recognizes members for their ability to design and sketch an interior design space using the provided interior design scenario.

Identification: Make sure the project is labeled with member name, chapter, and level.

Submission: Turn in at the registration desk.

SPECIFICATIONS

Create a floor plan, design the room specified for participants level.

- Level 1 - Children's bedroom. See attached.
- Level 2 - Adult bedroom. See attached.
- Level 3 - Living room. See attached.

ALL LEVELS:

1. Color and design the room given, using colored pencils or another medium, and include on the back of the 22' x 28" foam core board.
2. Participants will find samples for each of the following in the room:
 - Floor
 - Wall/ceiling
 - Fabric sample of at least one furnishing (chair, sofa, etc.)
 - Window covering
 - Furniture examples
 - Accessories for the room.
 - May include other samples if warranted, but must be on the board.
3. Participants will include
 - a one page description of the occupants of the room (i.e. - family, occupation, hobbies, etc.).
 - Participants will also include at least three elements of design and three principles of design, citing examples from the room.
 - The color scheme selected.

Interior Sketching

Floor Plan Drawn to Scale	Produce a floor plan for the identified room(s) correctly drawn to a consistent ¼" = 1' scale, with all architectural features indicated appropriately. Add, move, or remove doorways and windows, if desired as this will not cause any structural issues in the home. The dimensions of the room and its location in the provided floor plan cannot be changed.
Furniture Arrangements	Roughly sketch in furniture in furniture arrangements, to scale, for the identified room only. Arrangement will reflect appropriate furniture arrangement and includes balance/form, focal point/emphasis, line/harmony, and proportion.

Lighting Plan	Include the lighting plan for the room on the floor plan.
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Display

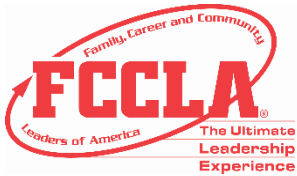
All event components along with name and chapter should be displayed on a single poster/display board. The poster/display board should be no bigger than 22' x 28" and include the following components:

Interior Sketching	Completed Interior Design Sketch
Explanation of Design	Up to one 8 ½" x 11" page. Explain the design choices, changes and updates that were made to the floor plan based on the scenario. Include information on how the elements (color, line texture, and shape) and principles (proportion, balance, rhythm, emphasis, and harmony) of design were used to solve the design problem.

PARTICIPANT QUESTIONS

There is no formal oral presentation for this event, however, participants should be prepared to answer the following questions at the designated set up time. These questions are designed to be asked conversationally. Participants will be evaluated on the quality of their answer, not on their presentation of responses.

1. What was your concern?
2. What was your goal?
3. What did you learn?
4. What would you change if you did this event again?
